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## **CROWN HILL CEMETARY HERITAGE TOUR**

**Crown Hill Cemetery, the third largest private cemetery in the country, was founded in 1863, when the old City Cemetery became too crowded with Civil War soldiers’ burials. In 1866, part of the land was dedicated as a National Military Cemetery, which it remains today. Crown Hill has 555 acres in the heart of Indianapolis.**

**The Heritage Tour will take you to the graves of well known citizens of Indianapolis, on a comfortable walk along winding roads and across landscaped lawns. A few of the highlights will be poet James Whitcomb Riley; President Benjamin Harrison; playwright, Booth Tarkington; and State Librarian, John Dillon.**

**Cost is \$5.00, which goes to the Crown Hill Heritage Foundation, a not-for-profit public charity. The Foundation preserves and restores historically significant landmarks and buildings in Crown Hill, as well as educating the public with tours and events. You can pay the guide when you arrive. There is no need to pre-book.**

**Driving time from the Hyatt is ten minutes.**

**Directions from the Hyatt Regency Hotel, located at 1 North Capital Street: Go one block east to Illinois Street (one way north). Take North Illinois to 34th Street (stop light). Turn left (west), and drive straight ahead for a few blocks. 34th Street goes directly to the main gate of Crown Hill, 3402 Boulevard Place. The entrance is an ornate stone archway. Follow the center white line up the hill to the Gothic Chapel (little church on the hill). Park anywhere along the road. The tour will begin at the Gothic Chapel, promptly at two o’clock.**
