Law Librarians are skilled information specialists working in academic, corporate, government, law firm and public libraries. We help attorneys, judges, members of the public, professors and students find information on legal issues. Most of us hold master's degrees in Library and Information Science; some also hold law and other advanced degrees. We perform a variety of duties relating to the organization and distribution of legal information, including:

- providing specialized reference and research services
- executing online database searches
- teaching legal research and materials use
- training on the use of print and electronic legal information sources
- evaluating and collecting legal materials
- designing and maintaining circulation and information storage and retrieval systems
- preparing fiscal reports, budgets and long range plans
- promoting resource sharing among libraries
