The Museum preserves in vivid detail Louisiana folk architecture through a collection of authentic buildings whose divergent construction traits illustrate the various cultural influences of our settlers. They include several rural houses, including a "dogtrot" cabin, and structures, such as a commissary, furnished to reconstruct the major activities of life on a typical 19th century working plantation. The museum's structural collection includes everything from a country church to a jail. The main building ("the Barn") contains hundreds of artifacts-- tools, utensils, furniture, and farming equipment-- dealing with everyday rural life dating from prehistoric times to the early 20th century,
