AALLNET Strategic Planning (Special)

In creating the new AALLNET, the committee will consult with AALL committees, special interest sections, caucuses, and entity webmasters and AALL staff. It will also keep AALL members and the Executive Board informed of its progress through regular communications to the membership.

Annual Meeting Review (Special)

The Association's Annual Meeting and Conference is the primary opportunity for members to interact face to face, attend educational programming, meet with vendors, learn about new products and services, and attend committee meetings.

In 2006, two significant changes to the meeting were implemented. The Annual Meeting was shortened by one day by eliminating Wednesday. Special interest sections were permitted to run programs against programs selected by the Association's Annual Meeting Program Committee.

Three annual meetings have occurred since those changes. It is appropriate to take a look at the meeting to ensure that it meets the needs of the membership. At this time, the U.S. and global economies are severely depressed. Should attendance numbers in 2009 not reach expectations, the committee would need to consider what effect that might have for attendance in the future.

The Special Committee is charged with:

- Researching trends in conference attendance for associations generally
- Taking a comprehensive look at the structure of the Annual Meeting and AALL's need for a larger than usual number of meeting rooms to accommodate the numerous committees and small meetings; addressing members' complaints about the number of conflicting meetings and solutions to ease these conflicts
- Taking a comprehensive look at the work of the Annual Meeting Local Arrangements Committee to determine the availability of volunteers, their level of satisfaction as committee members, and ways to improve the committee process
- Assessing educational programming by looking at program attendance and evaluations; determine from evaluations if rejected programming topics might actually have been of interest; evaluating the Annual Meeting Program Committee's single term appointment and if it is effective in the program selection process
- Assessing attendance at social events to determine AALL's effectiveness in marketing and generating interest for these events; evaluating the future of some of these events in response to the decline in sponsorship dollars; assessing members' willingness to pay individually for events that were free in the past
- Analyzing the impact of the meeting's location, including hotel and travel costs; determining how members choose to attend and if it is influenced by interest in the variety of cities offered or if there would be more benefit to reducing the meeting locations to just a few select cities, using a rotation schedule
- Suggesting ways to improve the Annual Meeting by determining what features of the meeting are most popular and appreciated, in an effort to provide value for members

The special committee will prepare a preliminary report for the spring 2010 Executive Board meeting and a final report, with any suggested changes to the structure of the Annual Meeting, for the summer 2010 Executive Board meeting.

Bylaws and Resolutions

Electronic Legal Information Access and Citation (ELIAC)

The Electronic Legal Information Access and Citation Committee shall use principles of the law library profession to identify web site characteristics and citation rules that represent best practices, and to encourage all branches of government to apply these principles in the creation and maintenance of electronic legal information. These principles include permanent public access, authenticity, citizen usability, uniformity of citation consistent with AALL policy, comprehensiveness and suitability for legal research, and they reflect the special concerns and unique competencies of law librarians.

The Committee will monitor and promote judicial, legislative and executive branch web sites at all levels of government to apply best practices in the creation and maintenance of electronic legal information. The committee will develop and maintain a web-based framework to categorize the various principles being successfully addressed by those sites.

In addition, the Committee shall monitor and promote citation initiatives and activities undertaken by the judiciary, the bar, the ABA, the Bluebook editors and other groups. The Committee will also serve as a resource for jurisdictions and other groups considering citation issues.

The Committee shall be responsible for advising the Association and its membership about issues relating to electronic legal information access and citation, and may be called upon to collaborate with other committees, including the Government Relations Committee.

The Committee shall also publicize the availability of scholarships, solicit applications, and award scholarships according to established criteria.
