“Statutory and Legislative History Research Using Print and Electronic Sources” is a detailed outline of a presentation on federal statutory and legislative history research techniques. The all-day presentation is offered to congressional staff as part of the Law Library of Congress’s Congressional Legal Instruction Program. The program covers federal statutes, the U.S. Code, and legislative history materials, including bills resolutions, committee reports, floor debate, and other congressional materials relevant to legislative history research. While the main focus is on resources that are freely available on the Web such as Thomas and GPO Access, some subscription databases such as HeinOnline and Lexis Congressional are also covered.
